

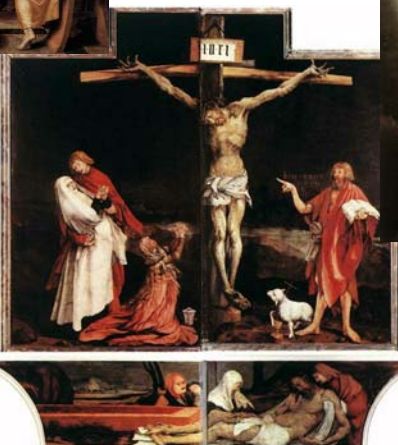

Sermon, 3/16: “I submit to you another reason” why the people’s cheers on Palm Sunday turned to jeers on Friday, the Rev. Dr. Brook Thelander said: “*schadenfreude* . . . (meaning) ‘malicious joy in the misfortune of another.’ . . . I submit to you . . . that at least part of the reason for Jesus’ suffering was *our* penchant for hurting and destroying one another. . . *We are the crowd.* . . (We) . . . sometimes demonstrate that type of behavior. That’s why confession is always an important component of Christian worship, or at least should be.”
